

Annual "Chinese Bridge" US High School Student Speech Contest

Our Confucius Institute has sponsored and hosted a highly competitive Chinese Bridge Speech Contest for high school students on the UMass Boston campus annually since 2007. This prestigious contest is now in its eighth year. It deepens cultural awareness between the US and China.

The Eighth Annual Chinese Bridge US High School Speech Contest will be held on April 7, 2013, at the University of Massachusetts Boston.

To participate, you must apply by February 23, 2013, by downloading an application at **www.umb.edu/confucius** and following the instructions on the last page of this brochure. Selected finalists will compete for the following cash prizes:

- First Prize: \$200
- · Second Prize: \$150
- Third Prize: \$100

Our annual Chinese Bridge US High School Speech Contest has attracted more than 1,000 students from more than 100 schools from throughout the United States. Over the past seven years, we have selected 144 students to come to our Confucius Institute for the final competition. From 2011, we added a talent show to the Chinese Speech Contest. Working with CLASS and dedicated judges, this program is well-recognized and appreciated by students, teachers, and parents. This brochure highlights our 2012 Chinese Bridge US High School Speech Contest.

Three winners from this contest will be chosen to participate in the International Chinese Bridge Speech Contest for High School Students in China. Hanban, the Office of Chinese Language Council International, which funds our US speech contest for high school students, will pay for the international airfare and all the expenses in China. The participants will enjoy a great experience as well as some scholarship opportunities.

Eighth Annual Chinese US High School Speech Contest

Application Information and Rules

- 1. Apply by February 23, 2013.
- 2. Each participant is required to mail or email the following materials:
- 1) Two completed Application Forms in English and Chinese which you can download from www.umb.edu/confucius;
- 2) A recorded and labeled audiotape or MP3 attachment (no longer than 3 minutes) of the speech you will present on April 7, 2013;
- 3) A transcript (in both Chinese and English) of the recording;
- 4) A student photo (2 inch x 2 inch in color).

Note: Incomplete applications will not be processed. No application will be accepted postmarked after February 23, 2013.

- 3. Twenty-four finalists will be invited to compete on-site on April 7. The invitation notice will be sent out by March 3, 2013, together with further details.
- 4. The theme of the speech is selected by the student. Students are free to develop the content based on their own language learning and life experiences (no poetry).
- 5. The speech must be between two and three minutes in length. During the on-site contest, up to five questions will be asked immediately afterword by judges, based on the delivered speech.
- 6. Students need to prepare a maximum four-minute Chinese cultural show (such as a Chinese song, a Chinese folk dance, Chinese instrument playing, traditional Chinese paper cutting, or martial art.)
- 7. Finalists need to bring all their own costumes and instruments to the performance.
- 8. Finalists must be present on-site to compete for cash prizes on April 7, 2013.
 - First Prize: \$200
 - · Second Prize: \$150
 - Third Prize: \$100
- 9. Three winners will be chosen to participate in the International Chinese Bridge Speech Contest for High School Students in China. Hanban, the Office of Chinese Language Council International, which funds our US speech contest for high school students, will also cover the international airfare and all the expenses in China. The participants will enjoy a great experience as well as some scholarship opportunities.
- 10. Students who have participated in a previous Chinese Bridge Speech Contest can only participate in the competition in the advanced group.
- 11. Heritage students already speaking Mandarin at home are not eligible.
